Curriculum news

Reception - This week we have been writing questions for the Evil Pea and Supertato! In maths we have been pegging out washing with numbers 11-20 on and trying to order the numbers correctly. Next week we will be writing sentences for the beginning and end of the story Supertato!

Year 1 - This week Year 1 have written their own version of 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson. Our story was about Zog's teacher, Madam Dragon and the lessons she learned at teacher school. Next week we will make our clay structures of our favourite London landmarks.

Year 2 - Year 2 have written some 'mooovelous' and 'eggciting' leaflets to persuade the reader to come to their farm. In maths we have used our knowledge of number to calculate difficult missing number sentences. In history we have looked at the reasons why people went to the seaside 100 years ago and how this has changed overtime.

Year 3 - We have worked hard on finding fractions of a set of objects in maths and enjoyed learning bounce pass and chest pass in PE.

Year 4 - In the three days we've been in school this week, we have been the busiest of bees. We have written the most incredible innovated versions of 'Snowboy and the Last Tree Standing' by Hiawyn Oram - not to mention meeting many of our writing targets; turned our classroom into an art gallery and thought critically about a variety of sculptures - thinking about their form, texture, colour, technique and style; conducted research about Tutankhamun with a particular focus on his death mask; and we've applied the different types of throws we've been learning to competitive games.

Year 5 - We have been writing our own suspense stories based on Clockwork by Phillip Pullman. In geography, we found out about supply chains and how a t-shirt is made and traded across the world. We continued to programme the Crumble boards in computing, adding further output devices. In RE, we learnt about the similarities and differences between different branches of Christianity.

Year 6 - This week we have been asked to create an exhibition in school about Winston Churchill by the Imperial War Museum. We began our exhibits by researching and creating biographies of his life and impact on World War II. In PSHE we have looked at the things in our lives that we control, others control and things we have no control over.

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
