

## **Anderton Primary School Governing Body**

Our governing Body was re-constituted on 01/01/2015 and this constitution is reviewed annually.

Anderton Primary School's governing body is made up of:

- 1 Head Teacher
- 1 Staff Governor
- 3 Parent Governors
- 1 Local Authority Governor
- 6 Co-opted Governors

All governors other than the Headteacher have a 4 year term of office.
