The Speaker of the House will deliver an assembly announcing the commencement of the election period.



Step 2

Children wanting to run for parliament will complete a *Declaration of Interest Form* and submit it to their Class Teacher.



Class Teachers will vet the submissions to ensure they are suitable representatives of our school, who embody our school values consistently.



The Speaker of the House will announce the candidates able to run for parliament via the parliament display board and accepted candidates will receive a *Candidate Acceptance Letter*.



Step 5

Candidates will meet with the Speaker of the House to be briefed on their campaign. The children will then prepare and run a campaign during Campaign Week by:

outlining a manifesto delivering a speech to their class creating & wearing their candidate badge making & displaying posters



Children will vote for a candidate from their class at the polling station on Election Day.



The Prime Minister, MPs and governing party (Explorers, Creators or Innovators) will be announced in an assembly delivered by The Speaker of the House.



The Prime Minister will meet with the Head of State for the Kissing of Hands Ceremony to discuss their manifesto and the school's priorities.



The Prime Minister will meet with parliament to assign roles: PE MP, Eco MP, Teaching & Learning MP, Inclusion MP, Behaviour MP & Well-Being MP.
