Curriculum news

Reception: We have been learning about the famous author Julia Donaldson. After reading some of her stories; they created Wanted posters for the 'Gruffalo', moulded characters using play dough from the story 'Zog' and constructed their own brooms from 'Room on the broom' using various items from outdoor. In maths this week we have explored using pictures and number lines to subtract one digit numbers.

Year 1: Year 1 have been learning about famous and significant people. We have also drawn what our self-portrait may look like when we are 100 years old! Some of us even received a birthday card from the queen!

Year 2: Year 2 have continued to work hard on reading comprehension and a variety of SPAG activities. We have started our new Multiplication Maths Topic. Keep working your socks off! Missing everyone x

Year 3: Year 3 have worked really hard learning about nouns and enjoyed using emojis and pictures from home to help them do this. Well done Year 3.

Year 4: We have been exploring the theme of celebrations; creating books for their innovated stories of The King of the Fishes, creating board games with a celebratory theme, and exploring how birthdays are celebrated around the world!
