Reception: This week in Reception we have been learning all about Music, we have made our own music shakers and drum kits using different household objects and performed our own shows. We have also written our own short stories, worked on number bonds and been on a shape hunt!

Year 1: Year 1 have been learning about fashion in the 1960's and have even dressed up a person in the correct clothing. We have compared them to the clothes we wear now. Then for a bit of fun, we had a dance with our families to 'Twist and Shout'!

Year 2: Year 2 have been working hard on their new Maths unit Money. In art they drew amazing portraits of Frida Kahlo-a famous Mexican painter. The children have worked hard on new spelling rules and how to use apostrophes. Keep working hard!
